## **SSG Curtis Reid Awarded Silver Star**

Staff Sergeant Curtis A. Reid, United States Army, heroically distinguished himself by exceptionally valorous conduct in the face of the enemy of the United States as the Bravo Section Leader in 1st Platoon, Baker Company, Task Force 1-15, 3rd Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division, on 03 July 2007 during OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM V.

SSG Reid demonstrated heroism and valor as a Bradley Commander when he saved the lives of four American Soldiers and one Iraqi interpreter after an improvised explosive device struck his Bradley Fighting Vehicle. The strike immediately caused the Bradley to be engulfed in flames and left SSG Reid with a severe concussion. In addition, the gunner, Private First Class Jones, was unconscious and the three Soldiers and one Iraqi interpreter in the back of the Bradley also sustained head injuries. SSG Reid immediately noticed that PFC Jones was unconscious from the blast, and started shaking him until the Soldier was conscious. Once awake, PFC Jones could not successfully get out of the the turret by himself. As fire and smoke filled the turret and hull, SSG Reid jumped on top of the turret, and pulled PFC Jones out of the vehicle and handed him over to the medic on site. Due to the damage sustained on the vehicle, the driver was unable to lower the troop ramp, and the four individuals in the back were unable to open the troop door. The Soldiers inside the vehicle managed to open the troop hatch; however, the main gun was oriented towards the rear of the Bradley hindering their escape. By this time, the flames on the Bradley were fifteen feet high and smoke was billowing from the hull. SSG Reid noticed that smoke had filled the troop compartment of the Bradley and that the soldiers could not extract themselves. Without regard for his own safety, SSG Reid got back inside the burning Bradley in order to manually raise the main gun. He successfully raised the main gun allowing the Soldiers in the back to push open the troop hatch wide enough to evacuate the vehicle. SSG Reid then got out of the turret and maintained his position on top of the Bradley rescuing the four individuals one by one. Once SSG Reid rescued the individuals that were inside his Bradley, he jumped off of the Bradley and started making his way out of the kill zone. After taking two steps away from the vehicle, he collapsed due to the extent of his own injuries. Minutes later he was evacuated by air to the 28th Combat Surgical Hospital for medical attention, where he was deemed in critical condition. SSG Reid is directly responsible for saving the lives of four American soldiers and one Iraqi interpreter. His decisiveness, leadership, and selflessness while injured and under enemy fire prove him worthy of respect and recognition.

Staff Sergeant Curtis A. Reid's actions are in keeping with the finest traditions of military heroism and reflect distinct credit upon himself, the "Audie Murphy" Company, the "Can Do" Battalion, the "Sledgehammer" Brigade, the "Marne" Division, and the United States Army.

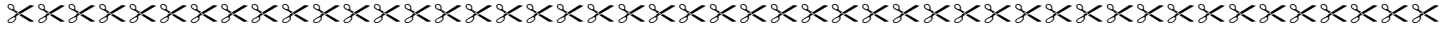
### SPONSORED MEMBERSHIPS

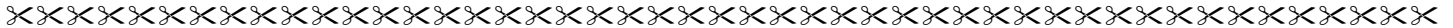

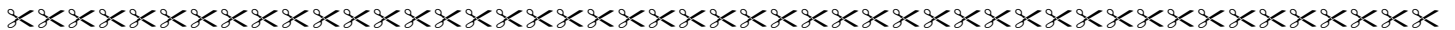

A single copy of the Dragon sent via bulk mail costs the Association 15 cents. A return costs the Association 45 cents! There is no slush fund for this, ladies and gentlemen. It comes right out of your annual dues and is becoming an ever increasing burden financially. We must cut some slack for our active duty troopers as they often are subjected to reassignment and relocation as well as separation. However, the majority of the non-active general membership is the culprits. 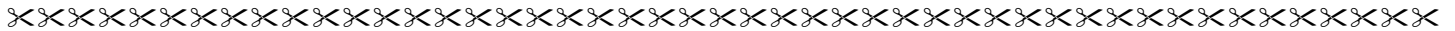

## **MG William Brandenburg Retires**

Major General William Brandenburg, former Commanding Officer of 1st Battalion, 15th Infantry Regiment, and First Brigade of the 3rd Infantry Division Retires. At an emotional ceremony near the Main Post Flagpole at Palm Circle on Fort Shafter, Hawaii, MG Bill Brandenburg retired after a distinguished career in the United States Army that spanned over three decades of service to the Nation. Of particular note, MG Brandenburg led the 1st Battalion of the 15th Infantry Regiment while it was assigned duties in Germany during the close of the Cold War. Later he led the First Brigade of the 3rd Infantry Division while assigned to Fort Stewart, GA. He served as the Commanding General of Task Force 134 during combat operations in Iraq. Prior to his retirement from active duty, MG Brandenburg served at the Deputy Commanding General of US Army Pacific and as the Commanding General of the 8th Sustainment Command.
